CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background of the Study

There are more combinations than [noun + noun] or [adjective + noun] that make up compound words. Compound

words require understanding and recognition. Other adjectives and nouns can be used to modify each compound noun, which functions as a unit.

Christiano, D. (2020) in his research on compound words found that: the types of English compounds are endocentric, exocentric, and copulative compounds. The second results showed that the lexical categories emerged from the construction process were noun constructions, verb constructions, and adjective constructions. Referring to the previous research, the researcher wants to see what types of compound words are used in daily communication in the Bajawa language, and see the structure of the compound words.

In this study, the author will analyze compound words in Bajawa. Bajawa language is a regional language spoken by native speakers living in Ngada district especially Bajawa sub-district, Golewa sub-district, West Golewa sub-district, South Golewa sub-district, Inerie sub-district, Aimere sub-district, So'a sub-district and several other sub-districts. Bajawa is a regional language that is still used today. The Bajawa language also functions as a means of communication used by the Ngada community members in general and the Bajawa ethnic in particular in everyday life. The Bajawa language is use both spoken and written. Spoken use can be observed formally as well as informally, such as in traditional ceremonies and churches ceremonies. The written form can be found in song lyrics and literary works.

The author sees that there is no previous research on compound words in the Bajawa language, so this is also attract for the author. This study aims to provide compound words in the Bajawa language for readers and writers to increase their

expertise, especially in linguistic studies. In addition, the Bajawa language is also one of the languages that are almost extinct due to the development of Indonesian as the national language which has a greater number of speakers than the Bajawa language in the Ngada Regency area. Thus, the writer is interested in conducting research on compound words in Bajawa language as an effort to preserve the language.
