5.1 Conclusion

1. The eleventh grade students of SMA Negeri 1 Kupang in the academic 2015/2016 still commited errors in writing recount texts. The kinds of grammatical errors that they made were misformation, omission, addition, and misordering. However, each of them made different types of errors and frequency of errors.
2. The most frequent of grammatical errors commited by the eleventh grade students of SMA Negeri 1 Kupang were omission (6.84%), addition (20.54%), misformation (69.86%), and misordering (2.73%).

5.2 Sugestion

In this part, the writer would like to suggest to the teachers and the students as follows:

The teacher should give more emphasis on grammatical aspect especially in using simple past tense, subject verb, plural marking, possessive pronoun and the preposition because the students still lack of knowledge in these parts.
